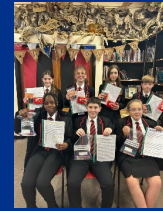

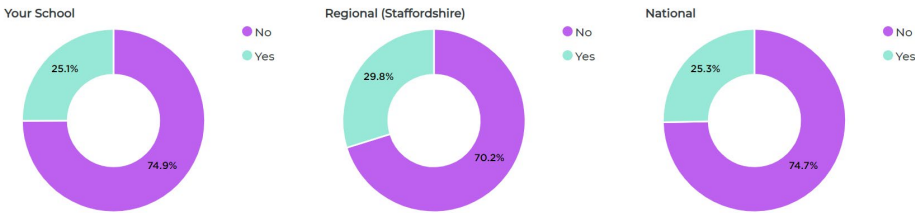

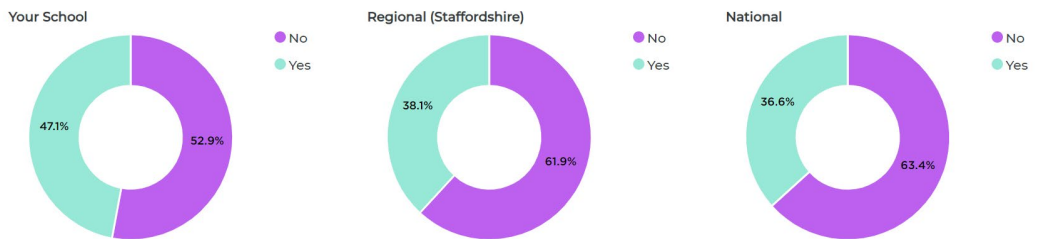
Should school holidays be redistributed?

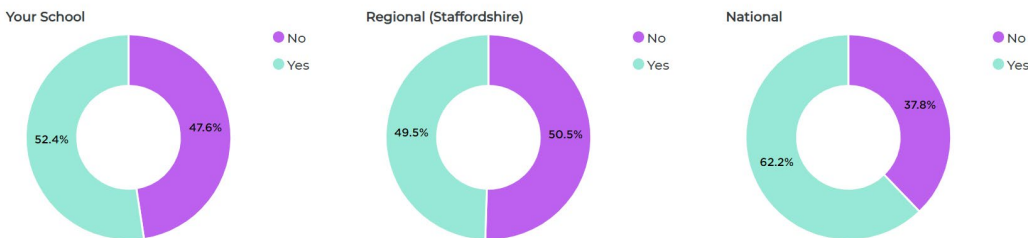

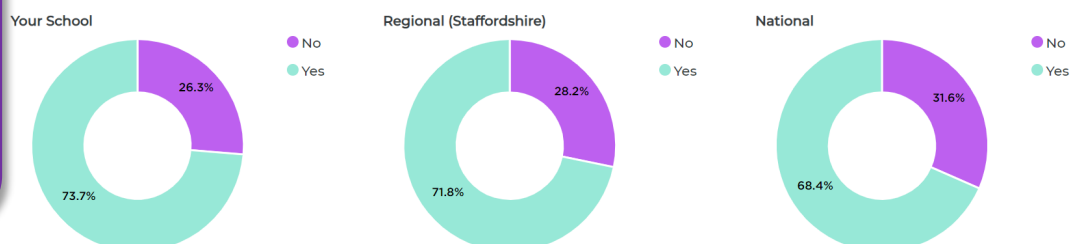
